
Albee, Sarah (J 391 ALB)

A whimsical depiction of a true moment in history describes how the innovative founding father used the scientific method to discern the practices of a famous Parisian magician.






Mercado, Yehudi (J GRAPHIC NOVEL MERCADO)



## Amari and the Night Brothers



## The Ghost Behind the Wall




## Dead End in Norvelt





## When You Reach Me


