
**Tiger the Police Dog**

**The Tortoise & The Hare**


Illustrations and minimal text relate the familiar fable of the race between a slow tortoise and a quick but foolish hare.


# Picture Books

Little green peas make their way into objects of many different colors, from blue boats, seas, and flags, to orange balloons, umbrellas, and fizzy drinks.




Berger, Samantha (J PICTURE BERGER)

Illustrations and brief text reveal the many styles of undies sported lots of veggie friends.




Dean, James (J PICTURE DEAN)

There are all different kinds of sheep but one of them seems to be missing.




Henkes, Kevin (J PICTURE HENKES)

A mother dog finds eight other animals hiding around the house before finding her lost puppy. Flaps conceal the animals.




Hort, Lenny (J PICTURE HORT)

This is the classic story of the adventures of a little boy in the city on a very snowy day.




Martin, Bill (J PICTURE MARTIN)

A big city garbage truck makes its rounds, consuming everything from apple cores and banana peels to leftover ziti with zucchini.




Neitzel, Shirley (J PICTURE NEITZEL)

With repetitive text, a young girl names all the clothes that she must wear to play in the snow.


Parr, Todd (J PICTURE PARR)

Whether looking at one's own nose and toes, helping others, or exploring the world, there is always something to love.




Patricelli, Leslie (J PICTURE PATRICELLI)
